

We've seen first-hand how job loss, forced retirement and the rising cost of living in Regional Victoria has led the elderly, disabled, and disadvantaged in our community to struggle to maintain a suitable level of care for their companion animal.



Couple this with rising social anxiety, and the isolation associated with rural living and these companion animals are more than pets to our prospective clients, they are at times their only company and a much-needed lifeline.

Through the work of RCVC there is a unique opportunity to contribute to creating a level of equity in pet care and ownership long needed in Regional Victoria, that goes beyond animal welfare and to the very root of social equality and care for those in our communities.

RCVC is a brand-new initiative and the first of it's kind in Regional Victoria. We aim to go beyond the traditional low-cost desexing and microchipping model and offer a holistic, outreach service to disadvantaged pet owners in the community.

Our objective is clear - we want no senior, disabled or financially disadvantaged regional Victorian to face any barriers in owning and caring for a companion animal.

Our financial target is to raise the additional capital required to create a purpose-built clinic in the heart of Mt Alexander Shire, which will serve as a hub for our outreach and community activity.

We have already secured a grant from the Victorian State Government to start our journey and now we invite you to invest in what we believe is a unique opportunity to make a positive impact on the lives of people and animals across Regional Victoria.

Regional Community Vet Clinic at a Glance

Regional Community Vet Clinic's goal is help those in dire financial need and who cannot afford veterinary care for their companion animal.

RCVC believes that in a prosperous country like Australia, no companion animal requiring veterinary attention should go without the necessary care required to live a happy and pain-free life.

However, RCVC understands that for some people access to preventative vet care is prohibitive due to financial disadvantage or other hardships. RCVC will work to improve the health of companion animals through preventative care programmes, desexing programmes and in-home support.

RCVC aims to help improve the health of companion animals who live with people unable to afford their care. By doing this we hope to help improve the health and well-being of community members.

Our Vision

For senior and financially disadvantaged regional Victorians to face no barriers in owning and caring for a companion animal.

Our Mission

To provide affordable, quality veterinary care for companion animals and their owners who are experiencing social and financial hardship in Central Victoria.

RCVC will establish a safety net of support and social connection to community members who are unable to care for and stay connected with their animals.

Relationships matter, we will be transparent and open with our clients and supporters.





Impact of Your Investment with RCVC

RCVC Service Offering:

Provision of preventative Veterinary Care

- Our research shows that over 15% of pet owners in our key demographic are currently not taking their companion animal to a veterinary clinic at all due to financial or physical hardship.
- Animals that are not receiving regular preventative veterinary care are at high risk for abandonment, surrender, euthanasia, or a life of unnecessary suffering.

Community Outreach Services

• RCVC has identified a portion of the population in our key demographic who are socially isolated due to age, ill-health, disability, or financial hardship that require assistance with the care of their pet.

Alleviate Stress on Local Vet Clinics

- The Veterinary profession is currently undergoing a global crisis, with a shortage of vets around the world.
- Several studies have identified veterinarians to be at a significantly higher risk of suicide than the general population. It is estimated veterinarians are four times more likely to fall victim to suicide.
- The attrition on the profession and increase in suicide rates can be attributed to the high emotional investment veterinarians have in their profession and the pressure they feel to treat patients even to their own financial detriment.

Increased Awareness & Care for Native Fauna

• By providing desexing and care facilities we hope to significantly reduce the feral cat population in regional Victoria. According to a recent CSIRO Study (https://www.publish.csiro.au/wr/WR19174) a single feral cat can be responsible for 576 native bird, reptile and mammal deaths each year.

Your investment in RCVC will help to:

- Build a dedicated clinic and space to offer preventative animal care to residents of regional Victoria who would otherwise not visit a veterinarian.
- Operate community health and awareness events Such as de-sexing days).
- Significantly improve the mental health of pet owners who struggle with guilt and anxiety over the care of their pet.
- Ensure that at risk pet owners do not have to make the choice between caring for themselves or their pet.
- Build a network of volunteers that can provide:
- o Pet/Owner Transportation
- o Home visits and check-ins
- o Administration of Medication
- o Pet Grooming
- o Pet Exercise
- o Temporary or Emergency Pet Boarding due to owners medical treatment or natural disaster
- Ease the emotional and financial burden from an already struggling profession by offering an alternative option for those clients who are unable to afford commercial veterinary fees.
- Give local veterinarians the ability to give back to the community without putting themselves or their practice at risk.
- Create a 'crisis' fund for animals beyond the scope of RCVCs in-house care to cover the cost of treatment at a private practice clinic.
- Operate community de-sexing programs for disadvantaged owners, small rescue groups and farms thereby reducing the feral cat population.
- Foster awareness and education around responsible pet ownership and living harmoniously with native fauna.


Pension Card Holders & Retirees

Financial Donations

One-off donation to the construction of a purpose-built vet clinic

Our most ambitious project is the construction of a 100% Not-for-Profit veterinary clinic in the heart of Mt Alexander Shire. We have been given preliminary approval by Mt Alexander Shire council for a block of land and have been awarded a \$200,000 grant from the Victorian State Government towards capital costs.

To complete the construction of this project we still need to raise a minimum of an additional \$200,000 for a complete build.

One-off or recurring donations to operating and running expenses

While our primary driver is the construction of the clinic, we have already commenced with a number of community initiatives, including de-sexing and vaccination days, as well as community outreach programs for community members who need some additional assistance with their companion animal at home.
